Both suspects are in custody at Monterey County Jail.

On 05/17/17 at approx. 1231 hours, officers from the King City Police Department were dispatched to the area of 800 blk of Broadway for a fight in progress. Further information was provided, the suspects, three male Hispanics left in a brown GMC Yukon and one of the occupants was wearing a lime green traffic vest. Upon the officer's arrival, the victim stated he was in the parking lot when the occupants for no reason and in an unprovoked attack struck him in the head several times. The victim declined medical aid and suffered minor injuries.

The ensuing investigation, officers were able to identify two of the suspects. Officers were checking the area for the suspect vehicle and located it driving west on Broadway from Canal and as the officers got behind the vehicle, the vehicle turned in the mobile home park in the 900 blk of Broadway. Officers conducted an investigatory stop on the vehicle and occupants, a passenger Miguel Godoy fled on foot and the driver, Juan Godoy obeyed officer's directives. After a short foot pursuit Miguel Godoy was taken into custody

without incident. As the investigation continued, Miguel Godoy was found to be the aggressor in the battery, as well as the unidentified male.

Both suspects are known Sureno Gang members and on supervision by the California Department of Corrections and Rehabilitation, Parole services unit. State parole agents were contacted and advised of the details of the investigation. Parole agents placed CDCR holds on Miguel Godoy for violating terms of his parole by committing new crimes and on Juan Godoy for associating with known Gang members.

Both suspects were booked in the listed charges.

The King City Police Department is currently pursuing active leads in this case in an attempt to identify the third suspect.
