

King City's Electoral Changes from At-Large to By-District

On May 24, 2016, the City of King City Council approved an ordinance changing how voters elect their city council members from an at-large method to a by-district method.

One Member of the City Council shall be elected from each district, by the voters of that district alone. Each Member of the City Council shall serve a four-year term until his or her successor is qualified. The Council Member elected to represent a district must reside in that district and be a registered voter in that district.


When you vote this contest on the ballot, you will see the words "vote for one"; this means you may now only mark one selection to vote for the council member from your district.

Council District Elections will alternate every four years, as follows:

November 8, 2016: Council Districts 3, 4 and 5; **November 6, 2018:** Council Districts 1 and 2.
