1. CALL TO ORDER:

5. PRESENTATIONS:

- A. Waste Management's 2018 Performance Report, presented by Elia Zavala, Salinas Valley Solid Waste Authority with a PowerPoint. 2018 - 50% Diversion Requirement - Exceeded
- B. Waste Management "Smart Trucks", Kristin Skromme, Waste Management, Inc. was presented with a PowerPoint. Cameras in and on the trucks helps with wrong dumping, over fills, contamination, to improve customer service.

6. PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS:

John Conricod stated that we owe it to our children hand on to them a great nation and not a third world cesspool. Council Member Cullen stated Salinas Valley Solid Waste Authority is reinstating their advisory board. He stated that the West Coast Barrel racing held at the fairgrounds over Labor Day weekend will be back for 2 more years. December 5th Salinas Valley Fair annual fundraiser polenta feed. The Carnival was not a money maker but would like to continue coming back for years to come.

Council Member Acosta stated she attended the trafficking conference in Monterey. She was disappointed in the attendance of local groups. She stated that she gained a lot of knowledge and there are so little resources for this. In the gangs there is a lot more trafficking happening in years past. She will follow through on finding more local resources. She feels that compiling resources and sharing resources with our sister cities is important. She appreciates that she was able to go to this conference and education is really crucial. She thanked the Mayor for letting us know about the service that MST provides for youth that need assistance getting out of a dangerous situation.

Mayor LeBarre stated that MST works with the youth that they can get to a driver and say they need a safe place. Mayor's meeting was held here in King City last Friday. He will be attending two conferences next week American Public Transit Association annual conference in New York and the League of California Cities Conference in Long Beach.
