Council Member Cullen stated Chamber of Commerce voted to go forward with 3rd of July Fireworks show. He wanted to recognize King City in Bloom and volunteers for the Earth Day clean up. COVID sign at the City Park has blown down. Joint Salinas Valley Solid Waste Authority, City of King, Waste Management and Board of Supervisors public forum Smart Truck was good to get information. Solid Waste Authority board meeting found that City of Salinas is in negotiations with their hauler, and they should have some kind of clarity in about 90 days. They passed their budget as well even though the issue of rates needs to be equalized throughout the Cities for green waste disposal. It will be continued to be worked on so that rates can be equalized.
