10. PUBLIC HEARINGS:

A. Consideration: An Ordinance Amending Parking Restrictions in the Downtown Area
Recommendation: introduce an Ordinance amending Municipal Code Chapter 10.22 to amend parking restrictions on portions of Broadway Street, Bassett Street, Second Street, Third Street, Vanderhurst Avenue and Russ Street to be read by title only, open the hearing, allow for public testimony, close the hearing, waive first reading of the Ordinance, and approve the introduction of the Ordinance.

City Manager Steve Adams introduced this item with a PowerPoint presentation. He stated that two comments were received on this topic.

Mayor opened the public hearing. He read the title of the Ordinance into the record.

Chris Davis, property owner in the 200 block of Broadway spoke in support of the proposed improvements. He explained where he sees more demand for parking.

Manager of Don Roberto's spoke in opposition of 2-hour parking for employees who work early mornings and late evenings it would force them to walk on the street to get to their cars in the back parking lot which they feel is dangerous.

Mayor LeBarre closed the public hearing.

Mayor LeBarre reopened the public hearing as there was one more person that wanted to speak through zoom.

Attisdei Arroyo, Don Roberto's Loss Prevention Department, thanked staff for emailing with him today. He stated his concerns for staff parking other places besides in front of the Don Roberto's for safety reasons.
