

**City Council Meeting
February 22, 2022**

1. CALL TO ORDER:

Regular Meeting called to order at 6:00pm by Mayor LeBarre.

The park opening had to be put on hold because of COVID and soccer balls were ordered and now have been given to the Recreation Department for next season. She presented Mayor LeBarre with a hard hat signed by all the people in their field.
